This week's "Boarder of the Week" and the person to win the kiwi (and the iceblock) is Jack Warren for showing such a great improvement in his bedmaking skills.

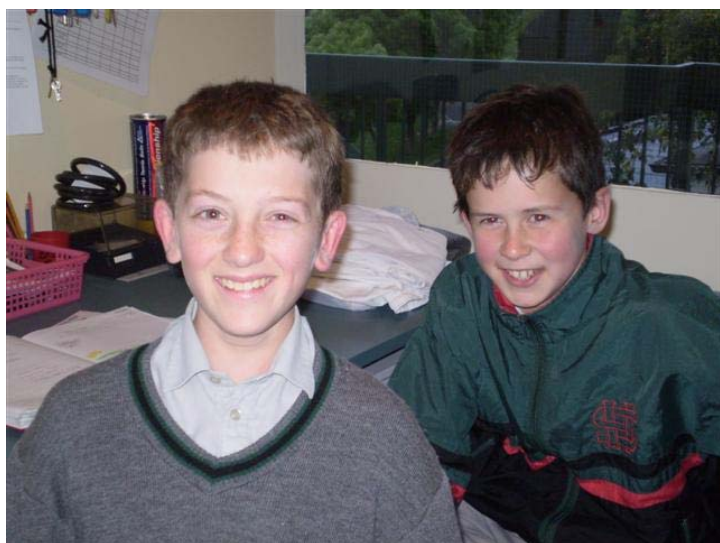
